#### **New York**

We started the year with our annual meeting of North American Cultural Centres with the Consul General in New York. This visit included a Culture Ireland showcase of newly created work ready for international touring by *Manchán Magan*, **Arán & Im**, *Margaret McAuliffe*, **The Humours of Bandon** and *Stephen Jones* with *Seána Kerslake*, **Northern Lights**.

The following Culture Ireland supported works were selected as cultural highlights of 2020 by The New York Times.

The Gate Theatre's production of <u>Hamlet</u> directed by *Yaél Farber* with *Ruth Negga* in the title role which had a sell-out run of performances at St. Ann's Warehouse, Brooklyn and

<u>Hope Hunt and the Ascension into Lazarus</u> (*Oona Doherty*) which played at the 92<sup>nd</sup> Street Y as part of the Irish Arts Center's programme.



## Philadelphia

In January Culture Ireland led a delegation from across the island of Ireland to the International Performing Arts for Youth
(IPAY) conference. Focus included showcase performances from Prime Cut's Removed, Branar's How to Catch a Star and a special one-hour presentation by the entire delegation to over 400 attendees.

## **New Orleans**

Hennessy, Corner Boy and JigJam
showcased with Culture Ireland support at
the 2020 edition of Folk Alliance
International in New Orleans. This marked
Culture Ireland's sixth year of participation
at this key industry conference.







## **Ireland Performs**

In early April in response to the lockdown, which restricted everyone's travel to within 2 km, Culture Ireland launched <u>Ireland Performs</u>, a series of online performances, presented in association with **FACEBOOK**. The 120 performances which were streamed from spaces including sheds, bedrooms and beaches have now reached over 1 million views.




## Ireland Performs 2020 Releases CD

To ensure that Irish artists stayed connected with programmers, presenters and international networks Culture Ireland worked through new digital formats in partnership with theatre and dance companies and resource organisations. Online engagement included **Edinburgh Fringe**Marketplace (August) Information Toolbox and International Theatre eXchange (Sept/Oct – in partnership with Irish Theatre Institute) and Meet the Artists events at **Dublin Theatre**Festival and Baboró International Arts Festival for Children.


